

Extension Survey of the Subdivision of T. 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS	
7.40	Ascend SW. slope, through dense timber and undergrowth, Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SW. Leave heavy, and enter scattering timber bears NE. and SW. Ascend S. slope.
27.10	Top of ridge, Umpqua divide, bears E. and W. Descend NW. slope.
39.00	Enter heavy timber, bears NW. and SE.
40.00	Set a serpentine stone, 24 x 8 x 8 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face; from which A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 18* E., 24 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 35 B T. A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 76* W., 14 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 34 B T.
50.00	Leave heavy timber, bears NE. and SW. Enter old burn.
76.00	Leave burn; enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
80.00	The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35. Land, mountainous. Soil, stony clay loam; 3rd rate. Timber, Fir, cedar, and hemlock. Undergrowth, fir, hemlock and lilac. September 26, 1913.

	October 3: At the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35. Thence I run N. 0* 1' W., bet secs. 26 and 27. Descend NW. slope, through dense timber and undergrowth.
5.50	Creek, 5 lks. wide, course W. ascend SW. slope.
20.00	Spur, slopes W. Along W. slope.
25.50	Begin descent of NW. slope.
39.35	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SW. Ascend SW. slope.
40.00	Set a serpentine stone, 15 x 10 x 6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face; from which A sugar pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 27* E., 17 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 26 B T.
