

Extension Survey of the Subdivision of T. 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS	
88.00	Leave slashing, bears NE. and SW.
89.40	Trail, bears NE. and SW.
90.80	Snow creek, 10 lks . wide, course NE. Descend along W. side of creek.
92.30	An abandoned cabin, bears E. 200 lks. dist.
93.45	Trail, bears NE. and SW.
94.66	Intersect S. bdy. of sec. 17, N. 89° 22' E., 11.59 chs. from the cor. of secs. 17 and 18, previously described. At the point of intersection, I Set a serpentine stone, 18x10x7 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 19 and 20, marked CC on S., with 5 grooves on E. face; from which A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 61° E., 30 lks dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 20 B T. A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 7° W., 18 lks, dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 19 B T. Land, mountainous. Soil, decomposed granite; 3rd rate. Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar. Undergrowth, rhododendron, arrowwood, fir and vine maple. October 23, 1913.

October 24: At the cor. of secs. 17 and 18.

Thence I run

West, bet. secs. 18 and 19.

Gradually ascend SE. slope, through dense timber and under-  
growth.

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28.41	Set a quartz stone, 12x10x8 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., on N. bdy. of sec. 19, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on S. face; from which
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A chinquapin, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 26° E., 33 lks.  
dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 19 B T.

A madrona, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 49° W., 31 lks.  
dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 19 B T.
