

Extension Survey of Subdivision of T. 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands of this township are mountainous and rough and the soil can, in general, be classified as 3rd and 4th rate. Indications have been found of silver, cinnabar and asbestos, but no mineral developments.

There is a good stand of heavy fir, hemlock, pine, and cedar over the entire township, the whole of which is undergrown with a dense growth of arrowwood, fir, hemlock rhododendron, lilac and vine maple.

There are two settlers in Sec. 20 and one each in Secs. 22 and 28.

The entire township has an abundance of good fresh water. There is a salt spring in southern part of sec. 14.
