39.00	Ft. of steep desc.
40.00	Set $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. post, from which, A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.18°E., 25 lks. A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.54°W., 52 lks.
	Va. 18°30'E.
48.50	Summit of line on E. slope of ridge and begin descending on SE. slope.
48.50	Enter Oak and Pine openings.
66.00	Stream, 1 lk. C., SE., at foot of steep descent and commence gradual ascent.
78.00	Top of a ridge, C. NW., and begin to desc.
80.00	Set post cor. of secs. 6, 7, 1 and 12, from which, A Y. Pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N.55°E., 40 lks. A B. Oak, 12 ins. diam., bears S.31°E., 76 lks. A B. Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears S.38 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 102 lks. A B. Oak, 12 ins. diam., bears N.41 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 170 lks.
	Land, steep SE. slope of mountain. Soil, second rate, red clay, loam and stoney. Timber, scattering, Oak, Fir, Y.Pine, Laurel, etc. Undergrowth, scruboak, Hazel, Laurel, Arrowwood, etc., thick.

	Va. 18°25'E.
	South, on West boundary of sec. 7.
18.25	Foot of Umpqua Mountains and enter Cow Creek Valley, C. S60°W. and N.60°E. This valley extends down the creek about 14 miles and up it 1 or 2 miles and is about a mile wide and mostly settled.
18.25	Leave openings and enter Fir timber.
