GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land subdivided in this Tp. along Cow Creek and it's tributaries, is generally of the best quality of alluvial land. The hills and mountain sides generally third rate. Trapstone or decomposed granite being on the surface. The timbers are mostly of the first quality of Fir, Cedar, Pine, Laurel, Maple, Ash, Yew and Chinquapin. Underbrush same with Vine Maple, Manceneta, Hazel and a specie of Spice.

Nine settlements are made, viz. the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and $E\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 4. The claims in sec. 5 undefined, the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 6. All of sec. 7, excepting the Eastern tier of forties. Claims in Sec. 18 undefined, and there still remains several almost as good bottom claims as have been taken.
