

Subdivisions, T. 32 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.18*W., 20 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T.

Desc.

55.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, C. N., 100 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, asc. spur.

57.25 Spur, sloping N., 25 ft. above creek. Desc.

60.00 Creek, 1 lk. wide, C. N., 25 ft. below spur.

Leave green timber, bearing N. and S., and asc. spur.

62.00 Top of spur, sloping N., 25 ft. above creek, desc.

64.25 Ravine, sloping N., 20 ft. below spur; asc. spur.

80.00 Top of spur, sloping N., 50 ft. above ravine.

Set a basalt stone, 12 x 10 x 8 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for corner of secs. 27, 34, 33 and 28, marked with 3 notches on W., and 3 notches on E. edges; from which,

A Dead Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.66*E., 60 lks. dist., marked T. 32 S., R. 4 W., S. 27, B. T.

A Dead Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.86*E., 44 lks. dist., marked T. 32 S., R. 4 W., S. 34 B. T.

A Dead Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.45*W., 77 lks. dist., marked T. 32 S., R. 4 W., S. 33, B. T.

A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.7 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 203 lks. dist., marked T.32 S., R. 4 W., S. 28, B. T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, third and fourth rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Pine, Hemlock, Chinquapin, Madrona and Yew.

Dense undergrowth of thimble-berry, manzanita, ocean-spray and rhododendron.

Mountainous land, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.
