CHAINS

marked T. 32 S., R. 4 W., S. 23, B. T.

This corner is on top of spur, sloping W., 120 ft. above creek.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, third and fourth rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Pine, Chinquapin, and Madrona.

Dense undergrowth of Fir, Cedar, Manzanita, Mountain Balm and Rhododendron.

Mountainous land, or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.

Thence, I run

East on a random line, bet. secs. 24 and 25.

40.00 Set a temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner.

80.11 Intersect N. and S. line, 9 lks. N. of the corner of secs. 19, 30, 24 and 25, which I set Aug. 16, 1897, thence, I run

North on a true line,  $89^{\circ}56'W.$ , bet. secs. 24 and 25.

40.05 Set a basalt stone, 16 x 14 x 8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. face, from which,

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears  $S.42^{\circ}E.$ , 35 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S., B. T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears  $N.75^{\circ}W.$ , 41 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S., B. T.

This corner is on the top of a ridge, bearing N. and S., 600 ft. above sec. corner.
