Dense undergrowth of Rhododendron, Vine-Maple, Chinquapin and Mountain Balm.

Land, mountainous, or covered with dense undergrowth.  
80.00 chs.

Thence, I run,

South 89°53'E., on a random line bet. secs. 12 and 13.

40.00 Set a temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner.

80.02 Intersect N. and S. line, 23 lks. N. of the corner of secs. 7, 18, 13 and 12, which I reestablished Aug. 16, 1897, then I run,

North 89°43'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 12 and 13.

Desc.

9.25 Ravine, C. NE., 75 ft. below sec. corner; asc. spur.

11.00 Top of spur, sloping NE., 25 ft. above ravine; desc.

15.35 Creek, 4 lks. wide, C. NE., 75 ft. below top of last spur; asc. the steep NE. slope of spur.

25.00 Top of spur, slopes N., 300 ft. above creek; desc.

33.25 Ravine, C. N., 50 ft. below top of spur; asc. spur.

40.01 Set a Chinquapin post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. on N. face; from which,

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.80°W., 39 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S., B. T.

A Chinquapin, 6 ins. diam., bears N.21°W., 13 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S., B. T.

This corner is on a hillside sloping E. 75 ft. above bottom of ravine.

41.00 Top of spur, slopes N. 25 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner; desc.

47.76 Creek, 1 lks. wide, C. N. 25 ft. below top of last spur; asc.

56.50 Top of ridge bears N. and S., 75 ft. above last creek; desc.

68.20 Creek, 3 lks. wide, C. NW., 200 ft. below top of ridge; asc. spur.
