79.70	Top of spur, slopes NW., 125 ft. above creek; desc.
80.02	To corner of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, 25 ft. below top of spur. Land, mountainous. Soil, third and fourth rate. Timber, Fir, Cedar, Madrona, Chinquapin, Yew, Maple and Live Oak. Dense undergrowth of Rhododendron, Chinquapin, Ocean-spray, Hazel and Salal-berry. Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.02 chs.
<hr/> At the corner of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, I run South $0^{\circ}2'E.$, on a true line, bet. secs. 34 and 35.	
4.00	Top of ridge, bears E. and W., 50 ft. above corner; desc.
5.10	Trail, bears NW. and SE.
12.00	Top of spur, slopes SE., 50 ft. below top of ridge.
18.50	Creek, 5 lks. wide, C. SE., 50 ft. below top of last spur; asc.
38.50	Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE. 150 ft. above creek. Desc.
40.00	Set a basalt stone, 12 x 10 x 8 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, from which, A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears $N.20^{\circ}E.$, 47 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T. A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears $N.21^{\circ}W.$, 30 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T.
	This corner is on the SW. slope of mountain, 50 ft. below top.
65.48	A Pine, 48 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.
