	<p>South 89°54'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 23 and 26. Desc.</p>
40.14	<p>Falls on a basalt stone, 30 x 18 x 16 ins. above ground. I cut a cross at exact point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner and mark $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. side; from which, A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.21°E., 13 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T. A Maple, 10 ins. diam., bears N.48°W., 32 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T. This corner is about 800 ft. below sec. corner.</p>
40.70	<p>Creek, 6 lks. wide, C. NW., 35 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner; asc. spur.</p>
49.00	<p>Top of spur, slopes N., 175 ft. above last creek; desc.</p>
62.95	<p>Creek, 7 lks. wide, C. N., 175 ft. below top of spur; asc.</p>
76.25	<p>Top of ridge, bears N. and S., 200 ft. above creek; desc.</p>
80.28	<p>To corner of secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27, 75 ft. below top of ridge. Land, mountainous. Soil, third and fourth rate. Timber, Fir, Pine, Cedar, Live Oak, Madrona and Maple. Dense undergrowth of manzanita, Rhododendron, Chinquapin, Vine-Maple and Madrona. Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.28 chs.</p>
	<p>North 0°2'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 22 and 23. Desc.</p>
15.25	<p>Top of spur, slopes N.30°W., 75 ft. below sec. corner.</p>
15.73	<p>A Fir tree, 30 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.</p>
30.21	<p>Creek, 10 lks. wide, C. NW., 250 ft. below sec. corner; asc. spur.</p>
