

Subdivisions, T. 32 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

- 58.00 Creek, 15 lks. wide, C. N.30*W., 700 ft. below top of spur. Asc.
- 84.20 The temp. corner of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, 400 ft. above creek.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, third and fourth rate.
Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Madrona, Chinquapin, Alder, Yew, Dogwood and Live Oak.
Dense undergrowth of Rhododendron, Vine-Maple, Salal-berry, Hemlock and Ocean-spray.
Mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth, 84.20 chs.
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- 3.50 From the corner of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, I run North 0*1'W., on a true line bet. secs. 11 and 12.
Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE.
Desc.
- 17.00 Creek, 3 lks. wide, C. NW., 350 ft. below top of ridge; asc. spur.
- 19.50 Top of spur, slopes SW., 50 ft. above creek; desc.
- 21.25 Ravine, C. SW., 25 ft. below last spur; asc. spur.
- 26.00 Top of spur, slopes SW., 75 ft. above last ravine; desc.
- 31.50 Ravine, C. W., 50 ft. below top of spur.
- 35.10 Leave green timber, bears E. and W.
- 37.50 Ravine, C. SW.; asc.
- 40.00 Set a white quartz stone, 20 x 14 x 8 ins., 15 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face; from which,
A Dead Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.77*E., 38 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T.
A Dead Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.36*W., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T.
