25.65	Foot of descent. White Horse Creek, 15 lks. wide, C. N., 850 ft. below sec. corner; asc. spur.
39.84	Set a Madrona post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which A Pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N.46 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 108 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T. A Pine, 30 ins. diam., bears S.33*W., 92 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B. T. This $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner is on the SE slope of spur, 375 ft. above creek.
43.30	Top of spur, slopes S., 30 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner; desc.
45.50	Ravine, C. S., 50 ft. below top of last spur; asc.
47.50	Top of spur, slopes S., 75 ft. above ravine.
69.50	Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE., 300 ft. above top of last spur; desc.
79.68	The corner of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22, 100 ft. below top of ridge. Land, mountainous. Soil, third and fourth rate. Timber, Fir, Cedar, Madrona, Yew, Hemlock and Pine. Dense undergrowth of Rhododendron, Chinquapin, Madrona, Mountain-Balm and Salal-berry. Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 79.68 chs.
