

Subdivisions, T. 32 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

from which,

A dead Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.32 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 16 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.62*E., 62 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

This corner is on NE. slope of spur, 200 ft. above creek.

51.75 Top of spur, slopes NW. 75 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner; desc.

64.00 Ravine, C. NW., 50 ft. below top of spur; asc.

94.25 Top of ridge, bears NE. and SW., 400 ft. above ravine. Enter green timber, bears NE. and SW.

Ascend along E. slope of mountain.

99.45 Intersect 7th Standard Parallel S., 32.27 chs. W. of the standard corner of secs. 31 and 32, which I reestablished Aug. 20, 1897,

Set a basalt stone, 14 x 10 x 10 ins., 9 ins. in the ground, for a closing corner of secs. 31 and 32, marked C C on N., with 1 groove on W. and 5 grooves on E.

faces; from which

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.62 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 97 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 4 W S 32 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.23 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 25 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 4 W S 31 B T.

This corner is on an E. slope, 75 ft. above ridge.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, third and fourth rate.

Timber, fir, madrona, yew and maple.

Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, hazel and thimble-berry.

Mountainous land, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 99.45 chs.
