

## Subdivisions, T. 32 S., R. 4 W.

## CHAINS

on E. edges; from which

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.97 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 300 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 4 W S 20 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.6\*E., 120 lks. dist.,  
marked T.32 S R 4 W S 29 B T.

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.14\*W., 141 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 4 W S 30 B T.

A Cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.58\*W., 105 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 4 W S 19 B T.

This corner is on the S. slope of spur, 150 ft. above  
creek.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, third and fourth rate.

Timber, fir, yew, cedar, hemlock and madrona.

Dense undergrowth of manzanita, chinquapin, hazel,  
rhododendron and mountain-balm.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with  
dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.

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East, on a random line, bet. secs. 20 and 29.

40.00 Set a temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner.

79.86 Intersect N. and S. line, 16 lks. S. of the corner of  
secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29.

Thence, I run

South, 89\*53'W. on a true line, bet. secs. 20 and 29.

Ascend.

4.50 Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE., 75 ft. above sec.  
corner; desc.

14.00 Ravine, C. SW., 150 ft. below top of ridge; asc. spur.

15.25 Top of spur, slopes SW., 25 ft. above ravine; desc.

24.00 Spur, slopes SW., 75 ft. below top of last spur.

34.84 Starvout Creek, 12 lks. wide, C. N., 170 ft. below top  
of spur; begin ascent.
