## CHAINS

- 36.06 Creek, 5 lks. wide, C. NE., 15 ft. above Starvout Creek.  
Thence, over bench-land.
- 39.59 Water ditch, bears NE. and SW.
- 39.93 Set a yew post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the  
ground, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on N. face, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner, from  
which
- A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.47\*W., 69 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.20\*W., 181 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- From this corner the NW. corner of Starvout Post Office  
bears N.57\*E., 264 lks. dist.
- 40.50 Fence, inclosing F. W. Miser's premises, bears N. and S.
- 41.25 Wagon road, bears N. and S.
- 58.54 Creek, 2 lks. wide, C. S.80\*E.
- 61.00 Begin ascent.
- 79.86 The corner of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, 200 ft. above  
bench.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, third and second rate.
- Timber, fir, hemlock, madrona, alder, yew, maple and  
cedar.
- Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, vine-maple, chinqua-  
pin, manzanita and salal-berry.
- Mountainous land, heavily timbered or covered with  
dense undergrowth, 75.00 chs.
