CHAINS

At point of intersection, I
Set a fir post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for a closing corner of secs. 8 and 17, marked C C T 32 S R 4 W on E., S 8 on N., and S 17 on S. faces, with 4 grooves on S. and 5 grooves on E. faces, from which

A Madrona, 12 ins. diam., bears S.52*E., 38 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 4 W S 17 B T.

A Madrona, 16 ins. diam., bears N.75*E., 27 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 4 W S 8 B T.

This corner is on NW. slope of spur, 25 ft. below top. Land, mountainous.

Soil, third and fourth rate.

Timber, fir, madrona, maple, oak, cedar and chinquapin.

Dense undergrowth of madrona, hazel, chinquapin, rhododendron, ocean-spray, salal-berry and thimble-berry.

Mountainous land, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 70.50 chs.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 32 South, Range 4 West is mountainous throughout its entire area. Within every section, run mountain streams of pure clear water. Two-thirds of this surface yields a heavy growth of large and valuable timber, which can be profitably utilized. The predominating species are fir, cedar, pine, madrona, hemlock, yew, maple, etc. Rhododendron, mountain-balm, manzanita, vine-maple,
