

Offset West on South Edy. of T. 32 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS	
40.00	Set qr. sec. post, from which A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.22*E., 168 lks. A B. Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears S.49*E., 78 lks.
40.00	Enter burnt timber. C. N. and S.
65.75	Stream, 3 lks. wide, C. N.20*W.
65.75	Ft. of steep descent.
67.50	Top of N. point of ridge.
68.50	Stream, 3 lks. wide. C. N.10*E.
68.50	Commence ascent of NE. slope of hill and leave burnt timber.
80.00	Set post cor. of Tps. 32 and 33 S. Rs. 5 and 6 W. on N. slope of hill, from which A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.88*W., 30 lks. A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.38*E., 30 lks. A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears S.38*E., 54 lks. A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.37*W., 69 lks. Land, hilly; mostly descending to the N. Soil, 2nd rate; clay loam. Timber on E. half very heavy, Fir, etc. On W. half mostly burnt. Thick undergrowth of Laurel, Chinquapin, Arrowwood, etc. Cow Creek Valley, is about 1½ miles N. of this point. May 10, 1854

West Edy. of T. 32 S., R. 5 W., as surveyed by Geo. W. Hyde and Wells Lake, Deputy Surveyors under Contract No. 54, dated Feburary 19, 1855.

South, on the West Edy. of Tp. No. 32 S. of R. 5 W.
 Set temp. mile and ½ mile posts, and at 5 miles, 75 chains, 80 lks., intersect the 7th Standard Parallel South, 3 chains West of Standard corner, therefore the correction will be 4.20 chains North.
