- 22.70 Top of spur, bears E. and W., 125 ft. above stream;  
begin steep descent.
- 31.10 A Stream, 3 lks. wide, C. W.; begin ascent of mountain  
ridge; stream is 100 ft. below top of spur.
- 34.00 A mountain trail, bears E. and W.
- 40.47 Set a granitestone 12x10x8 ins., 8 ins. in the ground  
and mound of stone, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face,  
from which
- A Y. pine, 14 ins. diam. bears N.44\*E., 41 lks.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. 33 B.T.
- A Y. pine, 14 ins. diam. bears S.41\*W., 21 lks.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. 32 B.T.

Continue ascent of mountain, covered heavily with fir,

- 53.50 Top of mountain ridge, bears E. and W., 80 ft. above  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.; 225 ft. above stream, 3 lks. wide.  
Begin steep descent of N. mountain slope.
- 71.00 Top of spur, bears NE. and SW., 175 ft. below top  
of ridge, continue descent.
- 80.47 The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33., 75 ft. below  
top of spur.

Land mountainous.

Soil gravelly 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine, oak, alder, dogwood.

Undergrowth, hazel, arrowwood, small fir.

 Mountainous or heavily timbered land 80.47 chs.,

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At the cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, which being gone;
