

Subdivisional Lines of T. 32 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.39*E., 33 lks.

Marked T 32 S R 5 W S 5 B T.

A Yew, 7 ins. diam., bears S.63*W., 39 lks.

Marked T 32 S R 5 W S 6 B T.

Thence I run

S.0*2'E., on a true line bet. Secs. 5 and 6.

Descend moderately mountain slope, covered heavily with timber.

4.00 A Creek, 6 lks. wide, C. S.80*W., 20 ft. below Sec. cor.

22.00 A stream, 1 lk. wide, C. W.

31.15 A spring branch, 1 lk. wide, C. W., begin ascent.

36.72 Set a cedar post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 on W. face and 5 on E. face, from which

A Cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S.42*E., 37 lks.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T.

A Cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.18*W., 51 lks.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T.

Continue ascending.

47.50 Top of spur, bears E. and W., 75 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., begin descent.

52.60 A dry gulch, bears E. and W., 100 ft. below top of spur, begin ascent.

62.25 A ravine, bears E. and W., 100 ft. above dry gulch, continue ascent.

72.75 Top of ascent, begin descent of W. slope.

76.72 The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, 40 ft. below top of ascent.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly, 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Sugar Pine, Cedar, Laurel, Dogwood.

Undergrowth, Hazel, small Firs, Poison Laurel, Mountain Balm.
