	<p>A Laurel. 15 ins. diam. bears N.82*E., 76 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 18 B. T.</p>
	<p>A Fir, 18 ins. diam. bears S.84$\frac{1}{2}$*W., 79 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S. 19 B.T.</p>
	<p>Only the stump of one of the original bearing trees remained; continue descent.</p>
42.10	A dry gulch, C. N.; begin ascent.
46.60	<p>Top of spur, bears N. and S., 100 ft. above dry gulch; begin descent.</p>
57.10	<p>A dry gulch, C. S.; 150 ft. below top of spur; begin ascent of a mountain slope, covered by oak and laurel timber, bears N. and S.</p>
75.60	<p>Top of ridge, dividing the waters of Windy creek and Cow creek, bears SW. and NE., 300 ft. above dry gulch; begin descent of NW. mountain slope, covered by oaks, maples, laurels.</p>
85.00	<p>The cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24 which having disappeared, I replace, by setting a cedar post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, marked T. 32 S., S. 18 on NE., R. 5 W. T.</p> <p>The three other bearing trees are the same, as described by the surveyor general.</p> <p>Land, hilly and mountainous.</p> <p>Soil, gravelly; 3rd and 4th rate.</p> <p>Timber, oak, laurel, maple, fir, pine, cedar.</p> <p>Undergrowth, hazel, small oaks and firs.</p>
