Resurvey of Subdivisional Lines of Tp. 32 S., R. 5 W.,

CHAINS

S. 10 on SW. and S. 3 on NW. with 5 on S. and 2 on E. faces, from which

A Laurel, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.36*E., 26 lks. marked T. 32 S. R. 5 W. S. 2 B.T.

A Laurel, 7 ins. in diam., bears S.66*E., 16 lks. marked T. 32 S R. 5 W. S. 11 B.T.

A fir, 6 ins. in diam., bears S.69*W., 59 lks. marked T. 32 S. R. 5 W. S. 10 B.T.

A laurel, 10 ins. in diam., bears N.42*W., 19 lks. marked T. 32 S. R. 5 W. S. 3 B.T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, third and fourth rate.

Timber, fir, cedar, laurel and maple.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land 80.21 chs., true C. of this line is S.89*43*E.

At the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

Thence I run

N.47*E., bet. secs. 2 and 3.

Descend.

4.32 A Spring branch, 5 lks. wide, good water. C. N.80*E., 100 ft. below cor.

Ascend S. slope.

8.65 Top of spur, C. E. and W. about 125 ft. above branch.

Descend.

17.36 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, pure water, C. E., 100 ft.

Below spur. Ascend.

38.00 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, very good water. C. E.

39.72 Old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. post, bears W., 28 lks. witnessed and ^{as} described by the Surveyor General, cor. stands on S. slope, continue ascent.

True C. of this line is N.23*E.

66.32 Top of ridge, 275 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., bears NE. and SW. along W. slope of mountain.
