A Dogwood, 9 ins. diam., bears S.35*E., 16 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.60*W., 11 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

80.00 Set a Cedar post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 2 ft. in the ground for cor. to secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, marked T 32 S R 6 W S 1 on N. E. S 12 on SE. S 11 on SW. and S 2 on N W faces, with 5 notches on S and 1 notch on E edges, from which

A Laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears N. Marked T 32 S R 6 W S 1 B T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. Marked T 32 S R 6 W S 12 B T.

A Laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears S. Marked T 32 S R 6 W S 11 B T.

A Cedar, 20 ins diam., bears N.72*W 47 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 6 W S 2 B T.

Land hilly and rolling.

Soil, 2nd. and 3rd. rate.

Timber, Fir, Pine, Cedar and Laurel. Undergrowth same.

East, on random line between Secs. 1 and 12.
