East on random line between secs. 20 and 29.

Va. 19°E

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

64.50 Top of ridge, course N. and S.

80.70 Intersect N. and S. line 20 lks. S. of cor. to secs. 20,

21, 28 and 29

Thence, S. 89° 51' W., on true line between secs. 20 and 29.

Va. 19° 30' E

40.35 Set a Cedar post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from whichA Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears, N. 80° E., 48 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.A Laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears, S. 54° E., 18 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

80.70 The cor. to secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.

Land hilly and mountainous. 3rd. rate.

Timber, Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, and Chinquapin.

Undergrowth same.

West on random line between secs. 19 and 30.

31.50 Top of spur, course S.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

67.90 Creek, 12 lks. wide, course SE. Ascend.

85.50 Intersect W. boundary of township at cor. to secs. 19,

24, 25 and 30, which is a Chinquapin post 4 ins. sq.,

firmly set in the ground and marked T 32 S R 6 W S 19

on NE. S 30 on SE. S 25 on SW. and T 32 S R 7 W S

24 on NW. faces with 2 notches on S. and 4 notches on

N. edges, from which

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears, S. 15° E., 28 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 6 W S 30 B T.

A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears, N. 85° E., 23 lks.
