45.76 Set a Fir post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor marked 1/4 S. on N. face, from which

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears, N.10°E., 14 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S B T.

A Fir, 7 ins. diam., bears, S.14°E., 40 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S B T.

85.76 The cor. to secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18.

Land hilly and mountainous, 3rd. rate.

Timber, Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel and Chinquapin.

Undergrowth same.

November 21, 1881.

North between secs. 7 and 8.

Va. 19°E

10.25 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SE. Begin ascent.

40.00 Set a Yew post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor marked 1/4 S. on W. face, from which

A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears, S.78°E., 48 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S B T.

A Fir, 46 ins. diam., bears, N.60°W., 12 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S B T.

60.50 Summit of high ridge, course SW.

80.00 Set a Chinquapin post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, marked T 32 S R 6 W S 5 on NE. S 8 on SE. S 7 on SW. and S 6 on NW. faces, with 5 notches on S. and E. edges from which

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears, N.85°E., 30 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 6 W S 5 B T.

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears, S.85°E., 37 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 6 W S 8 B T.
