CHAINS

- 4.40 Along top of high spur begin descent.
- 40.00 Set A Laurel post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 15 ins. in the ground, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on W face, for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. Cor. from which;
- A Cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears N.40\*E., 45 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- A Laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.80\*W., 62 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- 63.10 A Creek, 2 lks. wide course N.20\*E.,
- 80.00 Marked A Fir Tree, 28 ins. in diameter for the corner to sections 25, 30, 31 and 36 marked T 32 S R 7 W S 30 on NE S 31 on SE S 36 on SW and T 32 S R 8 W S 25 on NW with one notch on South and five notches on North edges, from which;
- A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.68\*E., 70 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 30 B T.
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.70\*E., 74 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 31 B T.
- A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.10\*W., 72 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 8 W S 36 B T.
- A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.82\*W., 100 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 8 W S 25 B T.
