A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.80*W., 8 lks.
dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

55.00 Top of hill course W Begin steep descent.

58.00 Descent Bluff course NW

65.20 Cow Creek, 160 lks. wide course N.20*E.

80.00 Set A Laurel post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long 4 ins. sq., 18 ins. in
the ground for the corner to Sections 7, 12, 13
and 18, marked T 32 S R 7 W S 7 on NE side, S 18 on
SE side, S 13 on SW side. R 8 W S 12 on NW side.

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.28*W., 40 lks.
dist. marked T 32 S R 8 W Sec. 12 B T.
