14.50 Cow Creek, 140 lks. wide course NW. Begin steep ascent.

20.50 Top of Spur course W. Begin steep descent.

23.90 A Creek, 12 lks. wide course W. steep ascent.

38.50 Gradual ascent.

40.00 Set A Laurel post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the ground, marked on West side $\frac{1}{4}$ S for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. from which;

A Pine, 44 ins. diam., bears S.85*E., 96 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Pine, 46 ins. diam., bears S.4*W., 102 lks. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

78.40 Top of Ridge course W.

80.00 Set A Cedar post, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet long 4 ins. in diam., 20 ins. in the ground for the corner to Sections 1, 6, 7, and 12, marked T 32 S R 7 W S 6 on NE side, S 7 on SE side, S 12 on SW side, R 8 W S 1 on NW side, from which;

A Pine, 45 ins. diam., bears N.80*E., 6 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 6 B T.

A Pine, 14 ins. diam., bears S.50*E., 140 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 7 B T.

A Fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S.8*W., 66 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 8 W S 12 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 123 lks. dist. marked T 32 S R 8 W S 1 B T.
