Va. 18°E.

Descend E Slope of mountain.

10.50 Dry Ravine, course E Leave timber.

40.00 Set A Fir post, 4 feet long 4 ins. diam., 20 ins. in ground, marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W side for the $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. Cor. from which:

A Pine, 8 ins. diam., bears East 74 lks.

dist. marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.70°W 18 lks.

marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

63.00 Enter Timber.

68.00 Top of ridge, course NE and SW.

72.00 Begin steep descent.

80.00 Set A Fir post 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the ground for the Sec. Cor. to Secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, marked T 32 S R 7 W S 13 on NE S 24 on SE; S 23 on SW and S 14 on NW faces also 3 notches on S and one notch on E Angles from which

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.53°E., 17 lks.

marked T 32 S R 7 W S 13 B T.

A Fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S.25°E., 38 lks.

dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 24 B T.

A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.88°W., 225 lks.

dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 23 B T.

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears ^N89°W., 38 lks.

dist. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 14 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil rocky broken 4th. rate.

Timber poor Fir, Pine, Cedar, and Laurel.

Undergrowth same. Live Oak, Balm and "Mansaneta." very dense.
