A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears S.40°W., 8 lks.
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 22 B T.

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.42°W., 25 lks.
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 15 B T..

Land rolling and rocky.

Soil 4th rate.

Timber chiefly Fir, Pine, and Laurel good.

Underbrush same and "Manzanita". Live Oak and etc.

E on Random line between Secs. 14 and 23

Ascend long ridge near summit.
