82.23 To Sec. Corner.

Land Mountainous.

Soil 2nd rate.

Timber good, chiefly Fir, Pine, Laurel, Cedar, Chinquapin
and Yew.

Underbrush same, Live Oak and Balm.

October 30th, 1881.

From the corner to Secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34 viz.,

A post $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long 4 ins sq., marked S C T 32 S R 7 W
on N side S 34 on E side and S 33 on W side, also
three notches, on E and W sides of same, from which:

A Cedar 12 ins. diam., bears N.55*E., 56 lks.
dist. marked S C T 32 S R 7 W S 34 B T.

A Fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N.75*W., 34 lks.
dist. marked S C T 32 S R 7 W S 33 B T.

A Cedar 24 ins. diam., bears S.20*E., 34 lks.
dist. marked S C T 33 S R 7 W S 4 B T.
