A Laurel 8 ins. diam., bears N.50°W., 43 lks.

T 32 S R 7 W S 21 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil clay 3rd rate.

Timber Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, Oak and Chinquapin.

Underbrush same.

E on Random line between Secs. 22 and 27

Va.20°E

7.00 Top of ridge course SE and NW

34.00 Trail course N and S

40.00 Set temporary 1/4 Sec. Cor.

74.00 Creek 3 lks wide course NW

80.40 Intersect line 27 lks N of cor. to Secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27

N.89°48'W on True line bet. Secs. 22 and 27 Va.17°30'E

40.20 Set A Cedar post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground with Stone Mound about the same, marked 1/4 S on N side for the 1/4 Sec. Cor. from which:

A Laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears N.5°E., 82 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam. bears S.80°E., 45 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S B T.

80.40 To corner to Secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28

Land hilly and mountainous.

Soil rocky 3rd rate.

Timber chiefly Pine, Fir, Laurel Cedar, Oak, and Chinquapin.
