

Subdivisions of Tp. 32 S., R 7 W.

CHAINS

T 32 S S 3 on SE S 4 on SW and S 33 on NW sides also three notches on E and W corners of same, from which:

A Cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears N.50*E., 25 lks. marked T 31 S R 7 W S 34 B T.

A Chinquapin, 12 ins. diam., bears S.36*E., 68 lks. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 3 B T.

A Sugar Pine, 28 ins. diam., bears S.20*W., 17 lks. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 4 B T.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.32*W., 30 lks. marked T 31 S R 7 W S 33 B T.

Thence I run

S 0* 27' E on a true line between secs. 3 and 4 Va. 18*50'E

42.16 Set A Laurel post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 20 ins. in the ground, marked 1/2 S on W side for the 1/2 Sec. Cor. from which:

A Laurel 6 ins. diam., bears S.25*E., 10 lks. dist. marked 1/2 S B T.

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears West 8 links dist.

82.16 To the Sec. Cor. to Secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10

Land mountainous.

Soil clay loam 3rd rate.

Timber chiefly Fir, Pine, Cedar, Yew, Laurel and Oak.

Underbrush same.

November 2nd, 1881.

From the Cor to Secs. 32 and 33, on the S boundary of the township which is a Chinquapin post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set in the ground, marked S C T 32 S R 7 W on N S 33 on the E and S 32 on the West sides. Also 4 notches on E and 2 on West, from which:

A Pine, 24 ins. diam., bears N.38*E., 35 lks. dist. marked S C T 32 S R 7 W S 33 B T.

A Fir, 34 ins diam., bears N.45*W., 53 lks. dist. marked S C T 32 S R 7 W S 32 B T.
