North between Secs. 16 and 17

Va. 19\* E

39.00 Top of Ridge, course NE and SW

40.00 Set A Cedar post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 20 ins. in the ground, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on the W side for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. Cor. from which:

A Pine, 40 ins. diam., bears S.30\*E., 20 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

A Pine, 40 ins. diam., bears S.45\*W., 63 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

Steep descent.

70.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide course SW

80.00 Set A Pine post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for the Cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, marked T 32 S R 7 W S 9 On the NE S 16 on SE S 17 on SW S 8 on NW also 4 notches on S and 4 notches on E angles of same, from which:

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.55\*E., 126 lks. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 9 B T.

A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.88\*E., 89 lks. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 16 B T.

A Pine, 10 ins. diam., bears S.28\*W., 75 lks. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 17 B T.

A Pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N.24\*W., 91 lks. marked T 32 S R 7 W S 8 B T

Land, mountainous broken.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber, chiefly Fir, Pine, Cedar and Laurel.

Undergrowth same.

East on Random line between Secs. 9 and 16

Va. 19\*E

5.50 Dry ravine course SW begin steep ascent.

29.00 Top of high ridge, course NE and SW descend
