41.53 Set A Fir post 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. from which;

A Pine, 20 ins. diam., bears N.78°E., 76 lks. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Live Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears S.89°W., 116 lks. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

81.53 To corner to Secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20

Land, broken and hilly.

Soil, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timbers, chiefly Pine, Fir, Laurel and Cedar.

Underbrush, same, with Live Oak Balm and "Manzanita".

There is a settlement near the middle of Sec. 19

Mr. Benson and two in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 18 Names not at hand.

North between Secs. 17 and 18

Va.18°45'E

12.00 Top of Ridge, course E and W Begin descend.

32.50 A Creek, 20 lks. wide course W Begin Ascent.

40.00 Set A Laurel post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W side from the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. from which;

A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.63°E., 15 lks. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Live Oak, 5 ins. diam., bears S.35°W., 14 lks. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

76.00 Top of ridge and trail course E and W

80.00 Marked A Fir Tree, 8 ins. in diam., for the corner to Secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18 marked T 32 S R 7 W S 8 on NE
