

Subdivisions of Tp. 32 S., R 7 W.

CHAINS

S 17 on SE S 18 on SW S 7 on NW faces, with 4 notches on the S and 5 notches on the E Angles, from which;

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.30\*E., 16 lks.  
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 8 B T.

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.30\*E., 21 lks.  
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 17 B T.

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.40\*W., 12 lks.  
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 18 B T.

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.60\*W., 48 lks.  
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 7 B T.

Land, mountainous broken.  
Soil, 3rd rate.  
Timber, chiefly Pine, Fir, Laurel and Cedar.  
Underbrush same, Live Oak, and Balm.  
Very dense on S slope of mountains.

East on Random line between Secs. 8 and 17  
Va. 19\*E.

- 7.00 Top of Ridge course N.80\*E
  - 40.00 Set temporary 1/4 Sec. Cor. Begin descent.
  - 63.00 A Creek, 2 lks. wide course S
  - 64.00 Top of Spur, course SW Begin steep descent
  - 71.00 Dry Ravine course SW Begin steep Ascent.
  - 80.20 Intersect Sec. line 32 lks. N of corner to Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17
- Thence I run  
N.89\*46\*W on true line between Secs. 8 and 17  
Va. same.
- 40.10 Set A Laurel post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked 1/4 S on N side for the 1/4 Sec. Cor. from which;
  - A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears North 8 lks.  
marked 1/4 S B T.
  - A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears S.10\*W., 7 lks.  
marked 1/4 S B T.
