CHAINS

80.20 To corner to Secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18
Land, high mountainous.
Soil, 3rd rate.
Timber, ordinary chiefly Fir, Pine, Cedar and Laurel.
Underbrush same, Live Oak and Balm.

West on Random line between Secs. 7 and 18
Va.19*E

Gradual descend.

40.00 Set temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor.

40.50 A Creek, 2 lks. wide course S 80*W

47.50 A Creek, 3 lks. wide course N 80*W Steep ascent.

64.00 Top of Spur, begin steep descend.

78.00 Cow Creek, 100 lks wide course N

82.15 Intersect at corner to Secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18 Viz;
A Laurel post 4 ins. sq., firmly set in the ground,
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 7 on NE S 18 and S E 13 on SW
and T 32 S R 8 W S 12 on NW faces, Also 4 notches on
S and 2 on N Angles of same, from which;

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.48*E., 15 lks.
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 7 B T .

A Pine, 15 ins. diam., bears S.30*E., 53 lks.
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 18 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.5*W., 64 lks.
marked T 32 S R 8 W S 13 B T.

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.28*W., 40 lks.
marked T 32 S R 8 W S 12 B T.

42.15 Set an Oak post, 4 feet long 4 ins. sq., 22 ins. in the
ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N side for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor.
from which;

A Laurel 7 in. in diam., bears S.54*W., 47 lks.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
