Intersect N boundary of Township 87 lks E of Cor. to
Secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32 Viz;
A Laurel post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set in the ground,
marked T 31 S R 7 W S 32 on NE T 32 S S 5 on the SE
S 6 on SW and S 31 on the NW faces Also 5 notches
on East and one on West angles of same, from which:
A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.10*E., 58 lks.
marked T 31 S R 7 W S 32 B T.
A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears S.54*E., 20 lks.
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 5 B T.
A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.32*W., 38 lks.
marked T 32 S R 7 W S 6 B T.
A Laurel 6 ins. diam., bears N.42*W., 30 lks.
marked T 31 S R 7 W S 31 B T.

S.0*37'E., on a true line between Secs. 5 and 6

Va.17*30'E

Marked a Live Oak Tree, 5 ins. diam., with $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W
side and two notches on N and S sides for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.
Cor. from which:

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 30 lks.
dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Laurel, 7 ins. diam., bears West 52 lks.
dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
