68.50 Top of ridge, course South and NE., steep descent

80.00 Set a Fir post $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for the standard cor. to tps. 32 South Rgs. 8 and 9 West, marked T 32 S on N R 8 W S 31 on E and R 9 W S 36 on W faces also 6 notches on the NE and W faces of same, and from which

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.47°E., 14 lks. dist.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.82°W., 16 lks. dist.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd rate.

Timber, densly covered with a forest of Fir, Pine, Laurel, and Cedar.

Undergrowth, thick, of Laurel, Fir, Live Oak, Balm, and Chinquapin.

General Description

This line runs near summit of mountains, on North side. The Townships on each side are broken and mountainous, generally covered with dense forests of Fir, Pine, and Cedar. Timber well watered with fine mountain springs and creeks. Gold is found in nearly all those on South side of mountain.
