Gradual ascent.

80.00 Set a Chinquapin post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. to secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24.

Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 13 on NE. S 24 on SE.

S 23 on SW and S 14 on the NW, with 3 notches on the S and 1 notch on the E edges of same, and from which

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.70°E., 40 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 13 B T.

A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears S.40°E., 38 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 24 B T.

A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.89°W., 29 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 23 B T.

A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears N.26°W., 85 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 14 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay, 3rd rate.

Timber, South part densely covered with a forest of Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, and Yew. Scattering on North part.

Undergrowth, thick of live Oak, Laurel, Chinquapin, Balm, and Huckelberry.

East, on random line between secs. 13 and 24.

Va. 19°45'E.
