- 2.30 A creek, 1 lk. wide, course East.
  - 6.00 A creek, 5 lks. wide, course SE.
  - 7.00 Steep ascent.
  - 40.00 Set a Chinquapin post 40 ins. long, 4 ins. sq., 20 ins. in the ground for the 1/4 sec. cor. marked 1/4 S on W side and from which
    - A Fir, 8 ins. in diam., bears S.58\*E.207 lks. dist. Marked 1/4 S B T.
    - A Chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears S.89\*W., 22 lks. dist. Marked 1/4 S B T.
  - 47.00 Trail to Rogue River, course West.
  - 53.00 Top of high ridge, course West and SE.
  - 54.00 Steep descent of NE slope.
  - 80.00 A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., which I marked T 32 S R 8 W S 12 on NE; S 13 on SE S 14 on the SW and S 11 on the NW faces also 4 notches on the S and 1 notch on the E angle of same for the cor. to secs. 11, 12, 13, and 14, from which
    - A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.22\*E.51 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 12 B T.
    - A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears S.52\*E., 44 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 13 B T.
    - A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears S.21\* W., 10 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 14 B T.
    - A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.60\*W., 36 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 11 B T.
