Land, steep and mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 4th rate.

Timber, chiefly of Fir, Pine, Laurel, and Cedar.

Undergrowth, densely covered and thick, Laurel, Chin-
quapin, Balm and Huckleberry.

East, on random line between Secs. 1 and 12.

Va. 19*45'E.

Descend.

- 12.00 West fork, 75 lks wide, course NE. Steep ascent.
- 20.50 O & C R R station house, North 300 lks.
- 24.00 Top of spur, course North, Descend.
- 31.50 O & C RR, course S.20*E., near tunnel No.2.
- 32.25 Cow Creek, 100 lks. wide, course NW.
- 33.50 Wagon Road, course North. Begin steep ascent.
- 40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- 58.00 Top of spur, course SW.
- 80.34 Intersect E bdy. of the Tp. 25 lks. S of the cor. to
Secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12, which is a Cedar post, 4 ins.
sq., firmly set in the ground and marked
T 32 S R 7 W S 6 on NE, S 7 on SE, R 8 W S 12 on
SW, and S 1 on NW, with notch on N and 5 notches on
S edges, and from which
- A Pine, 45 ins. diam., bears N.80*E., 6 lks.
dist., marked T 32 S R 7 W S 6 B T.
- A Pine, 14 ins. diam., bears S.50*E., 140 lks.
dist., marked T 32 S R 7 W S 7 B T.
- A Fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S.8*W., 66 lks.
dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 12 B T.
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 123 lks.
dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 1 B T.
