- 40.17 A Live Oak, 10 ins. diam., which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the N side for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., and from which
A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.65*E., 24 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
A Live Oak, 18 ins. diam., bears S.54*E., 79 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 80.34 The cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.
Land, mountainous and broken.
Soil, rocky, 4th rate.
Timber, Fir, Pine, Live Oak, and Laurel.
Undergrowth, thick Live Oak, Balm, Laurel, Chinquapin and Huckleberry.
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- North, on random line between Secs. 1 and 2.
Va. 19*45'E.
- 0.30 Trail to Jackass Prairie, course NW.
- 7.84 O & C RR, course SE.
- 9.50 Cow Creek, 200 lks. wide, course N.75*W.
- 11.00 Old Wagon Road, course NW.
Steep ascent.
- 40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- 80.20 Intersect N bdy. of the Tp., 22 lks. W of the cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, which is a Pine post, firmly set in the ground and marked T 31 S R 8 W S 36 on the NE., T 32 S S 1 on the SE, S2 on SW, and S35 on the NW faces, with 1 notch on the East and 5 notches on the W angles of same, and from which
A Pine, 48 ins. diam., bears N.62*E., 205 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 8 W S 36 B T.
A Laurel, 24 ins. diam., bears S.76*E., 109 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 1 B T.
A Laurel, 20 ins. diam., bears S.14*W., 49 lks. dist.
