CHAINS	North, between Secs. 14 and 15.
	Va. 19°45'E.
2.50	Top of ridge, course East and West. Trail to Rogue River. Steep descent.
40.00	Set a stone 20x12x10 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ S on W side, from which A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.30°E., 18 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T. A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.83°W., 33 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T.
40.50	A Creek, 2 lks. wide, Course NW. Ascend.
64.00	Top of spur, course NW.
80.00	Set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15, marked T 32 S R 8 W S 11 on NE, S 14 on SE, S 15 on SW, and S 10 on the NW faces, also 4 notches on the S and 2 notches on the E angles, and from which A Laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.40°E., 100 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 11 B T. A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.12°W., 54 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 15 B T. A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.50°W., 41 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 10 B T. A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.30°E., 36 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 8 W S 14 B T. Land, mountainous. Soil, 3rd rate. Timber, densely covered with forests, chiefly Fir, Pine and Laurel. Undergrowth, thick, Fir, Laurel, Chinquapin, balm and Huckleberry.
