- 80.40 Intersect N and S line 56 lks. S of cor. to Secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14. Thence I run.

A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears S.75*E., 20 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
A Laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears S.80*W., 5 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 52.00 Gradual ascent.
- 80.00 A Fir, 6 ins. diam., for the cor., to Secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, which I marked T 32 S R 8 W S 2 on NE face, S 11 on SE, S 10 on SW, and S 3 on the NW faces, also 5 notches on the S and 2 notches on the E angles of
