	Steep descent.
3.50	A creek, 8 lks. wide, course East. Steep ascent.
14.00	Top of spur, course East. Descent.
19.00	A creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.15*E.
40.00	Set a Laurel post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 20 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W side, and from which A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.75*E., 32 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 20 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
47.50	Top of spur, course East.
70.00	Top of ridge, course NE. Trail. Descend.
80.00	A Chinquapin, 6 ins. diam. which I mark T 32 S R 8 W S 22 on NE, S 27 on SE, S 28 on SW, and S 21 on NW faces, also 2 notches on the S and three notches on the E angle of same for the corner to secs. 21, 22 27 and 28, and from which A Laurel, 8 ins. diam. bears N.70*E., 97 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 22 B T. A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 15 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 27 B T. A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.60*W., 80 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 28 B T. A Pine, 12 ins. diam. bears N.14*W., 50 lks. dist. Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 21 B T.

	Timber, dense, chiefly of Fir, Pine, Laurel, Cedar, and Yew.
	Undergrowth, thick, Laurel, Fir, Balm, Live Oak, and Chinquapin.
