A Live Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears S.84°E., 65 lks. dist.
Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 28 B T.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.70°W., 58 lks. dist.
Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 29 B T.

A Fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N.5°W., 23 lks. dist.
Marked T 32 S R 8 W S 20 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky 3rd rate.

Timber, densely covered with forests of Fir, Pine and
