GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township contains a vast variety of lands from the most rugged mountain peaks to small valleys of the richest of loam. The mountainous land of various grades are largely in the preponderance.

The lands are generally covered with dense forests of timber of nearly all the varieties found in this county, however chiefly, Fir, Pine, Laurel, Cedar, Yew, Chinquapin, and Hemlock and is also very thickly covered with undergrowth of same kinds of timber together with Rhododendron, Live Oak, Balm, Hazel, Vine Maple and ETC. The Sugar Pine and much of the Fir timber are very valuable.

The township is well watered by Cow Creek and its tributaries.

The O and C RR runs through sec. nos. 1, 2, 12, and 13 and have a station at "West Fork" with good improvements. There are three settlements made in the township with a limited amount of improvements.
