40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of Sec. 1 only, with brass cap marked

57.00 West Fork of Cow Creek, 75 lks. wide, course SE., ascend S slope.

69.65 Trail, Dothan to Eden Valley, bears E and W.

71.24 Intersect the point for closing cor. of Tp. 32 S., Rs 8 and 9 W., located by reference to the bearing trees as described by the surveyor general; all traces of the cor. have disappeared. I perpetuate this cor., as follows: at the exact cor. point
