

Resurvey of East Bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber irregular on S. side of ridge, but little on N. side of ridge heavy. Fir, Pine, Cedar, Hemlock, Yew, Chinquapin, and Madrona.

Undergrowth, young Chinquapin and Manzanita. Very dense on S slope of ridge, also some Laurel and Salal.

Mountainous, heavily timbered or dense undergrowth.

80.00 chs.

North, bet. Secs. 7 and 12.

Va. 19°00'E.

14.50 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course west about 250 ft. below Sec. cor.

Ascend.

36.00 Trail bears E. and W. from West Fork Station to Eden Valley.

40.00 to a point 1.50 chs. N. and 2.20 chs. E. of old cor. which I obliterate.

Set a stone, 15x10x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face from which

A Fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears N.85°E., 73 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 7 B T.

A Pine, 30 ins. in diam., bears S.32°W., 43 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 12 B T.

51.50 A Spring branch course W.

68.00 Steep Ascent.

80.00 to a point 1.50 chs. N. and 2.30 chs. E. of old cor. which I totally obliterate.

Set a stone, 15x12x5 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for cor. ⁶ of Secs. 1, 12, and 7 marked with 5 notches on S and 1 notch on N. faces from which

A Fir, 22 ins. in diam., bears N.14°E., 110 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 9 W S 6 B T.

A Fir, 34 ins. in diam., bears S.81°E., 62 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 9 W S 7 B T.
