

Resurvey of Portion of West Bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

N.0\*46'W., resurveying W. bdy. of sec. 7.

Descend NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

7.00 Creek, 12 lks. wide, course SW.; ascend.

27.25 Trail, Eden Valley to Dothan, bears NE. and SW.; descend.

31.27 Intersect the old 1/4 sec. cor., which is a basalt stone, 15x10x8 ins., loosely set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I change this cor. to refer to sec. 12 only and perpetuate it as follows: alongside the old cor.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 cor. of sec. 12, T. 32 S., R. 10 W. only, with brass cap marked

A sugar pine, 40 ins. diam., bears S.42\*W., 43 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 12 B T (Old B.T.)

A laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.7\*W., 46 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 12 B T (New B.T.)

Thence

N.0\*02'W., continuing my measurements

Along W. Slope.

36.75 Leave heavy timber, bears N. and W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 cor. of sec. 7 only, with brass cap marked

A laurel, 5 ins. diam., bears N.12\*E., 34 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 7 B T.

A Pinon, 5 ins. diam., bears S.79\*E., 11 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 7 B T.

43.00 Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
